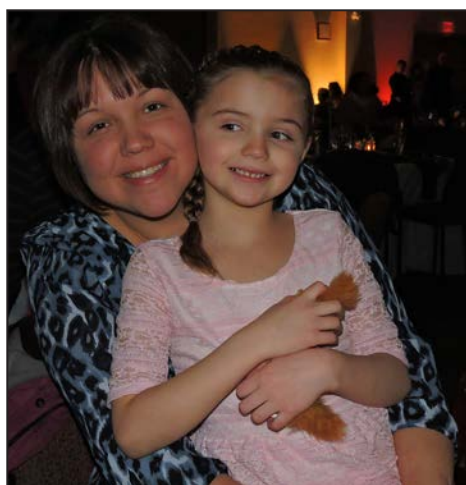

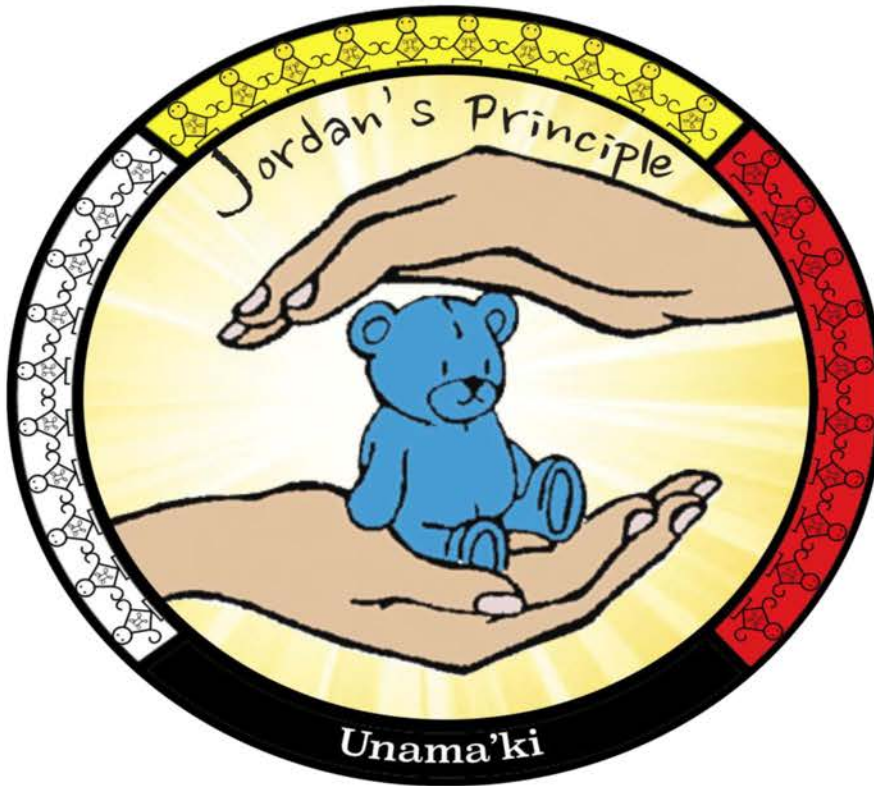

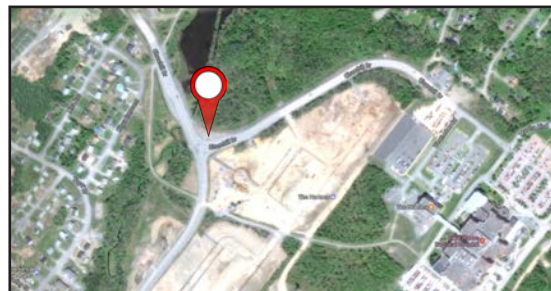

Dear Chief Terry, Membertou First Nation Counsellors, and community members:

It is with an enormous amount of gratitude that we want to recognize the community of Membertou for your many contributions to the very successful Blue & White Winter Ball for Cape Breton's grades 9, 10, 11, and 12 students.

As we are all aware, the labour dispute between the teacher's union and the Nova Scotia government made it seem that students would be collateral damage and would have to pay the biggest price for the disagreement. When things looked the darkest for students, especially graduating seniors, not to have an opportunity to celebrate special events and make lifetime memories, the community of Membertou stepped up into a leadership role that the students will never forget.

All we had were some people who had the will to persevere and the love of our students. We didn't have any money. We didn't have a venue. I'm sure that some people thought that we didn't have a clue! But, somehow, miracles happen!

I hesitate to name individuals who helped for fear of not mentioning everyone. It started by contributions of time and money. 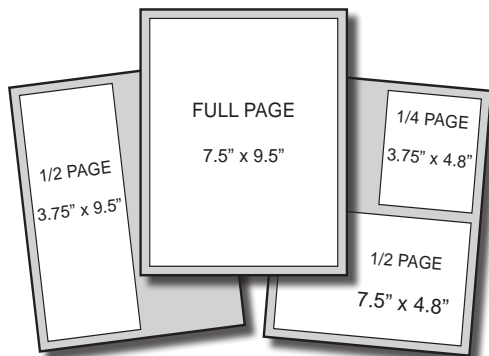
