Amid a sea of orange, Membertou community members and non-community members joined together in unity and support. The group walked from Sacred Heart Church to the bandshell at Wentworth Park. To ensure everyone who wanted could partake, busses also took Elders and those with mobility concerns along the route of the walk.

At the bandshell, there were speeches, dancing, and a beautiful moment where children joined in on drumming and singing of the Honour Song, in remembrance of the children of Residential Schools.

The walk would not have been possible without the guidance of Chrissy Christmas, organizer of the walk, who worked hard to make this important event possible, in only a matter of days. Thank you, Chrissy, for everything you have done to help turn Canada Day orange.

Vaccine Clinic

This week the Membertou Wellness Home held their final vaccine clinics at Membertou Trade and Convention Centre.

Membertou's first vaccine clinic opened in March at Membertou Entertainment Centre when community members 55+ began getting their first dose of the Pfizer vaccine. Among the first to get vaccinated was Membertou's eldest elder, Dave Moore, Senator Dan, and Chief Terry.

In May and June, first dose clinics opened to ages 40+, followed by 28-39, 16+ and 12+.

And just yesterday, July 8th 2021 all Membertou Community members 12+ received their second COVID vaccine.

Thank you to the Membertou Wellness Home and Health Team for all your hard work ensuring that the community received their vaccines and thank you to everyone who came out to get vaccinated!

This is an important step in helping to fight COVID-19!



Speed Radar Signs

with Mi'kmaw Knowledge Keepers and Elders

- Membertou feminine youth approximate ages 8 through 14 must have already started puberty (as marked by a change in voice or beginning of menses)
- For all feminine youth those who identify as female, non-binary, and 2S+ that want to be welcomed into the Mi'kmaw society of women
- Each participant is encouraged to bring a feminine family member to support them though this ceremony (mother, grandmother, auntie, older sister, cousin, etc.)

July 10th, 2021 - Start of Berry Fast and Sweat Session begins at 7:00 PM at Membertou Heritage Park

6:00 PM – Feast with families: Beginning of Berry Fast. Beginning of a 1 year long berry fast where participants will not eat berries until end of ceremony in July 2022. **7:00 PM – Sweat with Jane Meader.** Please bring a skirt and tshirt or long sleeved flannel nightgown, and a towel. Approximate end time of 9:00 PM.

Don't forget:

- A dish made with berries to share for the feast
- Clothes to wear during the sweat and a change of dry clothing
- A towel
- A feminine support person (adult)

Please contact <u>paulinameader@gmail.com</u> with questions. If you or your child have issues accessing the physical space and still wish to attend, we may be able to assist with transportation. The sweats will require parental permission. Can be given verbally or via email.
