

If a Used Needle Is Found In The Community:

- Get a non-breakable, puncture-proof container with a lid (Example: thick plastic jug);
- Place used needle inside of the container and close the lid;
- Take the container to the used-needle disposable unit, located by the back door at the Membertou Wellness Home (There are also smaller disposal units at both playgrounds);
- You can throw the container with the used needle directly into the disposal unit;
- Educate your child and encourage them to tell an adult if he/she finds a needle;
- Please seek urgent medical attention if a needle stick injury occurs;
- Diabetics must bring their containers of used needles to the Membertou Wellness Home.

Spring Home Maintenance Tips

Use the checklist below to get your home spring-ready:

- 1.) Install new batteries in smoke alarms & carbon monoxide detectors
- 2.) Test & dust all detectors
- 3.) Replace furnace filter
- 4.) Inspect bathroom & kitchen caulking – re-caulk as needed
- 5.) Test kitchen & bathroom exhaust fans
- 6.) Check fire extinguishers – at least once a month
- 7.) Clean gutters, check for leaks & make sure they're attached securely
- 8.) Clean & seal deck – if needed
- 9.) Check foundation for cracks & leaks
- 10.) Check exterior paint & touch up as needed
- 11.) Check siding & masonry for damage & schedule repairs
- 12.) Remove storm windows & install screens
- 13.) Repair/replace damaged window screens
- 14.) Inspect caulking around windows – if cracking re-caulk
- 15.) Check roof for damage & schedule re-roofing if needed
- 16.) Check attic for leaks, mould, moisture intrusion, fire hazards & critters
- 17.) Get rid of surface mould with Concrobium Mold Control °
- 18.) Schedule annual dryer exhaust cleaning & check up
- 19.) Check water heater for leaks – schedule inspection if older than five years
- 20.) Schedule a maintenance and/or energy efficiency inspection

Market-Based Housing Programs

The housing programs that fall under the market-based program were signed to assist band members who are willing and able to pay a market-based rent. These programs use the First Nations Market Housing Fund's Credit Enhancement Facility and cannot receive assistance from the Social department at any time for their rent or housing costs. Mortgages obtained under this program require a guarantee from Membertou, however Membertou is not obligated to provide a mortgage guarantee.

Community-Based Housing Programs

The housing programs that fall under the community-based housing program were designed to assist band members who are unable to pay a market-based rent. These programs do not use the First Nations Market Housing Fund's Credit Enhancement Facility.

What Are The Major Benefits of Membertou Managing Its Own Reserve Lands?

- Real recognition of Membertou's right to manage its reserve lands and resources
- Removal of reserve lands from the land management provisions of the Indian Act
- Community control over Membertou land management and development
- Inclusion of both off-reserve and on-reserve members in important decisions
- Increased accountability to members of Membertou
- More efficient management of Membertou lands and resources
- Transfer by Canada of Membertou Capital and Revenue Accounts
- Recognition of the right to receive revenue from interests in Membertou lands
- Recognition of Membertou's legal capacity to acquire and hold property, to borrow, to contract, to expend and invest money, to be a party to legal proceedings, to exercise its powers and preform its duties
- Protection against arbitrary expropriation of Membertou lands
- Protection against loss of Membertou lands through sale for surrender
- Ability of Membertou to protect the environment
- Recognition of significant law-making powers respecting Membertou lands
- Removal of the need to obtain Canada's approval for Membertou's laws
- Recognition in Canadian courts of Membertou's laws
- Ability to appoint Justices of the Peace
- Ability to create a local dispute resolution process
- Recognition of right to create modern offences for breach of Membertou's laws
